How M2 helps multilingual learners

In-ear support & instant translation

- Teachers can translate directions, explanations, or student questions on demand.
- Students can plug in and instantly hear summaries or translations of instruction in their home language delivered discretely and without distraction.
- Keeps every student engaged and learning alongside their peers.



Support every teacher

- M2 provides live feedback as teachers instruct — practical tips aligned with [WIDA ELD Standards](#), [SIOP](#), or any framework your school uses.
- Builds teacher confidence and capacity, turning every classroom into a multilingual-ready environment.

Set up in seconds and support on demand

1. Teachers set up M2 and assign language supports to remotes.
2. Students plug in USB-C headphones into their assigned remote.
3. M2 follows along with instruction in real time.
4. As needed, students tap a button on their remote to hear translated summaries of instruction.
5. At any time, teachers or students can tap the M2 screen to request a translation, question, or culturally relevant example in any language.

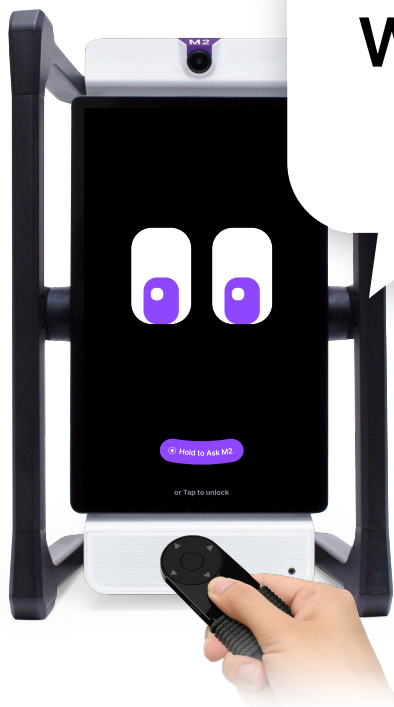
